Field Day is June 26th

All ham radio people understand what a Field Day event is, right? We all get our Sunday going to meeting clothing and head out for a good day of fun, comradery, perhaps some ingenuity, physically strenuous totting, lot'sa atta boys, and ham magic with contacts anywhere the skip leads us.

It is another opportunity to show our fellow earthlings that we can deal with emergencies and disasters with technical fixes, fancy gadgets, and just-plain know how & spirit. Many of us have been involved in Field Day since the days of 811's and 6146's. RTTY and SSB notwithstanding. Oh, the joy of it all and a Public Service besides. This event and others like it show the Public what we do and how we do it.

Estimates say that well over 42,000 folks that have a call sign following their name on FCC records will be out, about, and saying "CQ Field Day" for a while on June 26 & 27. It brings together public service, community outreach, disaster preparation, and ham skills in an annual celebration display that takes place the last full weekend of June and has been for nearly 90 years.

This year's Field Day will begin at 1400 EST on, Saturday, June 26 thru Sunday, June 27. This years location will operate from Ann & Chuck Dever Reginal Park on San Casa Drive, Englewood. Dever Park is East of 775 approximately 1.5 Miles.

While plans are not fixed in cement, yet we plan on three operating stations with flexibility for band operations that needs to follow the generally improving sunspot activity. I am hoping for all bands from 6M to 80M but that de-

pends on participation and Mother Nature.

Anybody that can help with setup, teardown, clean up, operations, food?, planning, materials, hardware, rigs, or any other essential please get in touch with fellow members and we will organize appropriately. 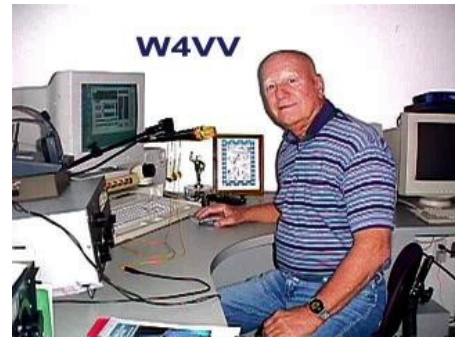
Breakfast at Denny's

Frank Maren – W4VV – SK at age 93 – by Ken Blackshaw, W1NQT

My earliest memory of Frank would be the ARRL Field Day club activity in 1997. Back then we set up behind the Methodist Church on Dearborn. Frank was always one of the experts guiding antenna setup – shooting wires over tree tops and then running feed lines into the tents where the actual stations would operate. On Sunday after we shut down Field Day operations, Frank was the chef, grilling hamburgers and hotdogs, and singing a lot of songs. All the XYLS and other family members would show up and we'd have a good feed.



From Tom Hawes, WA3PRC – “I would call Frank the grillmeister., Always after our field day we would have a picnic and Frank would take over the grill and grill our hamburgers and a good job he did.”

Frank's FD activities continued through 2009 and perhaps longer. He was another of the great old timers who participated, now Silent Keys - including Ken Anderson, W4JQT, Marty Horowitz, N4FA, JR House, K9HUY, and John Fogle, W1JF.

I also remember Frank as the man with a hundred songs – one of my favorites was the Chiquita Banana song which Frank could sing from beginning to end.

Frank was also a DX Star. The ARRL DX Honor Role shows him with 343 Countries (DX 'entities') confirmed. He will always stay ahead of our good friend, the late JR House, K9HUY, who finished at 341.

Gene Reilly, KI4FJJ comments, “He was a real asset to EARS in a variety of his contributions. When I first met Frank, I fondly remember how his face would light up when we would talk about baseball and his own baseball career. Then during Frank's last few years, I had a few opportunities to be Tom's substitute driver, chauffeuring Frank to our Tuesday breakfast gatherings. It was rewarding and just fun to exchange our "old war stories" with Frank. God bless Frank and his family.” Gene Reilly

Vic Emmelkamp recalls – “Frank was also heavily involved in the Hurricane Charley recovery effort in 2004. He helped at the LA Ainger site and set up the Red Cross operation at Tringali Center. There was also a write up in the Port Charlotte newspaper with pictures of him reinstalling a homeowners TV antenna which was blown down as a result of Hurricane Charley.
