Bill Reed introduced Gus Hawkins who offered a presentation on the Military Heritage Museum (MHM) and its activities. The museum is located in Punta Gorda.

The MHM is a registered non-profit with goals to educate community youth and adults.

- For youth the museum operates a STEM (Science,

Technology, Engineering and Math) and History Camp the camp provides youth with an opportunity to learn about HAM radio through its "Radio is Everywhere" program. This gives local youth a chance to go on the air through the museum's own radio station W7MHM.

- Last year the museum received a grant through Amateur Radio Digital Corporation to strengthen its STEM program. \$15,000 was for radio equipment and \$45,000 for educational programs. The grant process took approximately 5 months. The MHM is expanding its radio capabilities to add DMR and DSTAR.
- The MHM can use additional volunteers at all times, particularly for the radio aspects of its programs as well as museum volunteers.

Members asked Gus many questions regarding the museum and its activities.

President Bill Reed thanked Gus for his presentation and service to the community.
