### DX REPORT

Let start off with Solar Flares, all of you know that Earth was hit with several Solar Flares at the begining of March,, They did cause some interruption of communication in the ham bands... many times I turned on the radio to hear noise and weak signals,, this lasted for a few days than all was back to normal.. what was interesting is that one morning at 803am I could not hear my friends in North Pennsylvania but I was able to swing my beam toward the South Pacific and work the Island of Tonga on 15m CW with a 599 report

Other than what I call normal DX I was able to copy or work the following stations around the world. Asia with XW3 (Laos), T6 (Afghanistan, an American), AT2 (India) and a YB8 (Indonesia). South Pacific A35 (Tonga). Than africa 3C0 (Annobon Island), 3V8 (Tunesia), All good DX,, you should give it a try

It is very simple to work 100 Countries for the DXCC,, If you do it I suggest using LBOW due to the cost of postage today,, Also the DX Expeditions always have a very nice card and for that I would send direct to the QSL manager with a couple green stamps....

#### **SOLAR FLARE NEWS**

Save this solar flare predictions for future reference.

### Head Principle;

1. Large solar storms are induced by 2 or more planets heliocentrically aligned with the Sun. This means that the centre of the combined planets has to go through the centre of the Sun

- 2. or more planets that heliocentrically align on the opposite sides of the Sun
- 3. Combinations of the above.

For instance take the 4-7 March date First Mars and Earth line up with the Sun Then Mercurius and Venus X5.4 Flare on 3/7/2012 @ 00:24 UTC - Sunspot 1429

Here the dates that we expect solar events, due to planetary alignments:

March 21st 2012
April 22nd 2012
May 25th
June 6th, 7th, 8th and 9th
June 25th till 27th 2012
July 29th
August 12th 2012
August 22nd till 28th 2012
September 21st 2012
October 3rd 2012
October 14th till 22nd 2012
November 13th 2012
December 3rd 2012

Let's look at the planetary alignments of December 16-17 2012, Jupiter, Earth, Venus in a line... (not with the Sun) Venus, Mars and Neptunus in a line (not with the Sun) And on 18-19 December... Saturn, Venus, Mercury ,Sun in a line...
