Member Spotlight

Vic Emmelkamp, K4VHX



Vic Emmelkamp was born and raised in Detroit, MI. He attended Mackenzie High School from 1950 - 1954 and graduated from Wayne State University in 1958 with a degree in Business Administration. Vic ended up at the Westinghouse Corporation from which he retired in 1994. At Westinghouse in Pennsylvania he held positions in purchasing, aerospace (working on the nuclear engine program), the commercial nuclear power division before moving to the turbine group, located in Orlando, FL.

Vic has three grown sons; Bob, Scott and James, and a cat named Peaches. Vic met his wife Liz at Westinghouse in Orlando, and they have been happily married for 23 years.

Vic and Liz were avid sailors for more than 15 years and, after retirement, spent 3 years (1997 - 1997) living onboard their sailboat. Home port was Melbourne, FL, but they sailed the Eastern seaboard, the Bahamas and the West coast of FL, where they found Englewood and fell in love with it. They moved here in 1997. They don't sail much anymore, but they have a 20' Seaswirl bowrider docked in their backyard for fun and games.

Vic was a generation "H" kid. While attending high school he discovered Heathkits, the "H", and started his lifelong interest in electronics. He served in the Navy Reserve from 1953 - 1961 serving on several ships-of-the-line, including the DDR USS Corry. He was an electronics technician and was honorably discharged with the rank of ET-3.

Vic's first, about 1953, Heathkit was a stereo amplifier of about 20 watts output. Hi-Fi was just developing back then, and so were 33 1/3 records. One of his buddies, Bob Fulks, was really into electronics and was building a video tape recorder, way ahead of its time. Bob went on to MIT and became V. P. of Engineering for General Radio. While at Wayne State, Vic and his friend Gerry, W8WFN, were training to be Electronic Technicians in the Naval Reserve. Gerry was Vic's first Elmer, and they still maintain a schedule on 14.160MHz every Monday morning.

Even with Vic's early interest in electronics, he did not become interested in amateur radio until he retired and was living aboard his sailboat. After seeing the need to communicate with other vessels and to receive weather and navigation information while cruising, he decided to start studying for his amateur license. Ken Anderson, W4JQT, was Vic's second Elmer. He took Ken's Technician class and received his ticket in January, 1998, KF4VHX. Vic upgraded to General class in June of 2000, and to Extra in June of 2002. He is K4VHX.

Vic has many interests besides Ham radio and computers. He is a volunteer at the Charlotte County Library, the Humane Society and the Habitat for

Humanity. He is "on call" for all radio and humanitarian efforts and is a mentor for young and old alike. A finer person would be hard to find.

Vic has been a member of EARS for several years and has served as Secretary (2000), President (2001), and is presently our Treasurer.
