Crew spruces up volunteers' home

GULF COVE — Mel and Maryann Rathbun are longtime volunteers in the Englewood community. Maryann has been a volunteer at Englewood Community Hospital for the past 11 years. She is there at least four hours every week to comfort family and friends of patients in the Intensive Care Unit. Mel is a volunteer officer for the Charlotte County Department of Emergency Management. He, along with a team, ensures the lines of communication are kept open during emergencies and other natural disasters.

On Saturday, the Rathbuns received an early Christmas gift from about a dozen volunteers.

Organized by Sue and Larry McNamara, the 14th annual Christmas in July event took place at the Rathbuns' home.

Employees of Doctor's Choice Home Care, Englewood Health and Rehab and other friends gathered to power wash and paint the home, wash windows and -7 landscape the yard. OF Mel and Maryann watched the team work together from their living room window.

“This is so wonderful — how can we say thank you

for something like this?" Mel said. "It really needed to be done, but it's hard for us to get around, and I just can't do that kind of work anymore."

Maryann said when Sue first approached her about this idea, she was reluctant to agree to it.

"I thought no, there are others that need the help more than we do," Maryann said.

After several hours of hard work, the home had a fresh coat of peach paint, new shrubs lined the front of the house, and the windows were sparkling clean.

Sue, a nurse and community liaison for Doctor's Choice Home Care, said she came up with the idea years ago because she thought it would be a nice way to thank hospital volunteers.

"Every year, I speak with the hospital volunteer program leaders and I get names and ideas from them," Sue said. "Then I go out and evaluate the home and see who needs the help the most."

Sue's husband Larry, owner of Mac Lawn Services, provided lawn maintenance Saturday, as well as donating some shrubs and a tree.

"We have always enjoyed helping others, but this is just amazing," Mel said. "We are so appreciative, and we are so blessed."
