Ears Field Day - 2006

The 2006 Englewood Amateur Radio Society Field Day was held at the unpaved parking area of the Englewood United Methodist Church. A 20-foot by 40-foot tent was rented from the church and set up by the Boy Scouts Crew #36.

Two 125 foot wire dipoles were put up using existing trees for support. One dipole was oriented for N-S directivity and one for E-W. A 5 element beam was put up for 6 meters, and a Cushcraft R-5 vertical for a GOTA station. The antennas were all up and ready Saturday morning.

The operating plan was to have one station for CW, one for SSB, one for 6 meters and the GOTA station. As it turned out, the wire dipole for the SSB station developed a problem so the R-5 GOTA antenna became the antenna for the SSB station. The wire antenna trouble turned out to be a bad splice in the ladder line, but was not discovered until near the end of Field Day operation.

A rather severe thunder storm interrupted operation around 6pm Saturday. Operators on duty at the time put the radio equipment in cars to keep it dry and waited for the storm to pass. Murphy's Law was demonstrated one more time since we only had three sides for our tent and the storm attacked us from the fourth side. Operation resumed again around 6:30 p.m. The tent survived the storm ok.

Operation continued through the remainder of the Field Day period without further interruption. Propagation was excellent on 40 and 20, somewhat limited on 15 and non-existent on 10. Six meters was monitored continuously at 50.125 MHz and occasionally came to life giving us a total of 34 contacts.

The final tally on number of contacts was 262 on CW and 209 on SSB.

We had two fairly new hams join in with us, both TARC members. They were Blake Hudson, KE4SGK, and Diana Gregory, KI4GRF. Diana commented it was really a valuable experience for her to be able to participate in the station set up, particularly the antenna raisings. Also getting some operating experience on 15 and 20 was great. She is just learning about propagation and the real effects of sunspot cycles on communication. The GOTA opportunity was wonderful for her.

Around noon on Sunday we began to shut down and get ready for our traditional picnic. It was well attended and enjoyed by all. Frank, W4VV did his usual good job as chef and many of us enjoyed Keith Kelly's excellent chili.
