Obituary for Aldo DiSalvo, KC4NUX



Aldo A. DiSalvo, 82, of Port Charlotte, FL., formerly of West Hartford, passed away peacefully Tuesday, (May 13 2008) at the Tidwell Hospice of Venice, attended by his devoted wife Dorothy, after a short illness. Born December 23, 1925 in Hartford, he was the son of the late Antonio and Santina DiSalvo.

Aldo attended Buckley High School, leaving in 1945 to enlist in the United States Army Air Corps. He served with the 13th Air Corps, 22nd Troop Carrier Squadron as a radio operator throughout the pacific theater. Returning to settle in Hartford, Aldo began a long career as an automotive and diesel mechanic, including over 25 years with the Metropolitan District Commission, retiring to Florida in 1987.

During his life, Aldo was always an avid learner, and returned to school, first to finish his high school education and later to obtain his Associates Degree in automotive teaching from Hartford Technical Community College. He taught automotive maintenance and small engine repair for West Hartford Adult Continuing Education for many years. In the early 1970's Aldo answered God's calling and studied to become a Roman Catholic Deacon. He was ordained on February 23, 1975 and served the parishes of St. Luke in Hartford, St. Mark the Evangelist in West Hartford and St. Charles Borromeo in Port Charlotte, FL. Most recently Aldo served as a pastoral care counselor at Peace River Regional Medical Center in Port Charlotte, FL.

In retirement, Aldo continued the radio training he began in the US Army Air Corps and obtained an Extra Class amateur radio license and was

registered as operator KC4NUX. Aldo was active in many amateur radio clubs in the southwest Florida area, and was instrumental in developing and installing the Peace River Regional Medical Center's emergency operations center.

Aldo is survived by his loving wife of 57 years, Dorothy (Spragg) DiSalvo, of Port Charlotte as well as his son, Anthony and his wife, Cassie of Springfield, VA and Andrew and his wife, Celine of Glastonbury; his grandchildren include Daniel of Springfield, VA and Drew and Philip of Glastonbury. Aldo is also survived by his sister, Ann Rodas and her husband, Jesus Rodas, MD of California; his sisters-in-law, Joyce Zapulla of East Hartford and Ninetta DiSalvo of Rocky Hill; a brother and sister-in-law, Donald and Judy Spragg of Hebron; nine nieces and nephews and many cousins.

He was predeceased by his brothers, Frank and Sebastian. Calling hours will be held Tuesday, May 20 from 6-8 p.m. at the Church of St. Mark the Evangelist, 467 South Quaker Lane, West Hartford. A Mass of Christian Burial will be on Wednesday, May 21 at 10 a.m. at the Church of St. Mark the Evangelist, 467 South Quaker Lane, West Hartford. Burial will be immediately following the Mass at Mount Saint Benedict Cemetery in Bloomfield.
