MEMBER SPOTLIGHT KEN ANDERSON - W4JQT

Ken Anderson was born in Ladoga, Montgomery County, Indiana on May 8, 1922. He attended schools locally, through high school, where he was one of five members of the radio club

Ken served in the U. S. Army Signal Corps from 1942 through 1946, seeing service in Italy, Germany, France and the U. S. After discharge from the Army he studied Radio Engineering at the Valparaiso Technical School in Valparaiso, Indiana from 1946 through 1948.

On June 21, 1947 he married Alice Marie Scott, the "beautiful young lady" he had met in South Bend, Indiana. Ken and Alice have two children, Cathy and Marty, and four grandchildren.

Ken worked for AT&T from 1948 until his retirement in 1982. He called South Bend, Indiana; Cincinnati, Ohio; Chicago, Illinois; Washington, DC and Oakton, Virginia home while with AT&T. Ken specialized in radio engineering at AT&T, working on microwave system design, system test and troubleshooting.

After retirement from AT&T, Ken worked from 1982 through 1990 for the Government Systems Division of, what became, the American Satellite Company in Washington, DC. His work with DARPA while at ASC led to innovations still in use today.

Ken was first licensed in 1947, as W9CLU, Class B. He received his license from the FCC Chicago office while living in Valparaiso. In 1948 he obtained his First Class Radiotelephone License.

While working in Washington, DC, and living in Virginia, Ken received his current call, W4JQT, in 1965. He was active in the Virginia Wireless Society in various positions, including President. He is now a Life Member of the society. Ken is a Life Member of IEEE, the old Institute of Radio Engineers, and is a VE. He teaches basic and advanced radio classes to perspective hams and those looking to upgrade their license.

Ken and Alice moved to Englewood in 1990 and have lived at their present location on Bay Vista Blvd. since then. It should be noted that Alice is a licensed ham with the call KE4TVS.

Ken joined EARS in 1990 and has been an inspiration to members and guests, alike. He is active in church affairs and many amateur radio, community and fraternal organizations. And, as with EARS, he is ready, willing and able to tackle any tasks, large or small, coming his way. He has served as Secretary Pro Tem, and Emeritus, of EARS from 1990 through the present administration and is a Trustee on the Society. It is impossible to measure what Ken means to EARS. He is an advocate, a visionary, and a driving force to better this Society.
