I received the following from EARS founder and first President – Don Spencer – WA4IWL:



"My interest in radio began in High School where I built a couple of two tube radios. They were battery operated.

When I first started working I bought a Hallicrafters radio for \$99 from the store of Hatry & Young in Hartford, CT. Then I built a 160 meter transmitter. The coil was made of ½ copper tubing and it was loop modulated. I bootlegged a call.

Then radio lost interest for me for a while because I got married and family life.

I got my novice license in Florida and my regular ham ticket in Boston, MA at the FCC office. I was one nervous character. My was WA4IWL. The date was 1960. In the year of 1988 I started the Englewood Amateur Radio Society and it has been a successful club ever since. The 1988 date I am not sure of. It seems to me it was before that.

I am still on the air with a Kenwood TH 22 AT thanks to Ken Anderson – W4JQT. He shipped it to me in MA where I am living in an assisted living place. My age is **92**. Ken also made my 2 M antenna from ladder line and it is taped to my window where I work the local repeater.
