July 8, 2025

The meeting was called to order at 1916 hours.

CCFLARES – Data links are being updated in order to provide a more robust network – this has included changing internet carriers. Last month's exercise was changed up to a hurricane event in order to test all participants capabilities and response. There will be a TECH class during July with testing on August 7th. On June 24th CCLARES as well as EARS members participated in a Mass Casualty exercise at Englewood Hospital and other HCA facilities (Fawcett Hospital and Emergency Clinic at Wellen Park) – this was organized chaos for approximately 45 minutes with much activity. Additionally, the Englewood Fire District participated in this drill and they found it very gratifying to have the EARS radio operators on site as well as Steve Bishop (a former fire Captain) who was immediately recruited to act as dispatch for the exercise.

Pico Balloon launch – the club is looking to work with one of the local schools to do a balloon launch late this year or early next year. Volunteers are needed to help with this.

Fall Picnic – there was discussion of a fall social picnic – probably in November. Shirley Duke volunteered to coordinate this activity.

NEW BUSINESS

Discussion was initiated on the purchase of either an additional Club Banner or a table runner with the Club Logo on it. The discussion centered on the need and options.

TIPS FOR REPEATER USE:

Avoid '*kerchunking*!' All too often while monitoring **N4EAR**, I hear a carrier pop on there, and then drop off with no ID. The correct way to do this is to say 'this is – your callsign – listening.' <u>Unidentified transmissions</u> are an FCC rule violation!

I know, it seems like the repeater is idle most of the time, but sometimes three or more stations want to be on at once. The key is to allow a few seconds between transmissions. Don't just start talking the moment the other station drops the mike. Listen for other stations!

If you have more than two stations in a conversation, hand the mike to one of them – else you end up with doubling and frustration. Remember to listen for other stations, possibly even one needing to make an iportant call.

To start out, just give your call sign and say 'listening.' Avoid '*Kerchunking*.' That is bringing up the repeater without ID-ing.
