Jim Nelson discussed EARS' role during Waterfest this year. EARS will be providing radio coordination and security during the Boat Parade on Friday evening and also during the boat races on Saturday and Sunday. Bill also showed members the web site AMATEUR.SONDEHUB.ORG which is used for tracking ballons in real time. The HS program also works with robotics and also electric vehicles – the class recently built a functioning electric vehicle.
